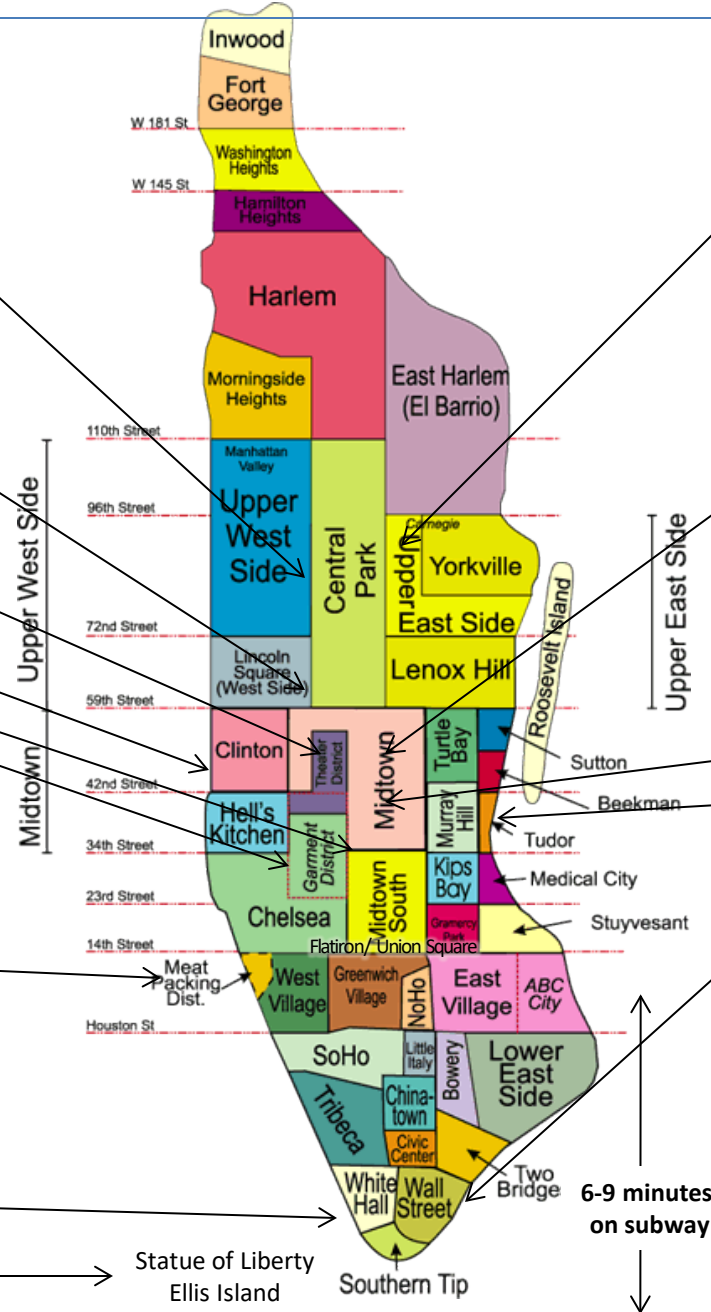

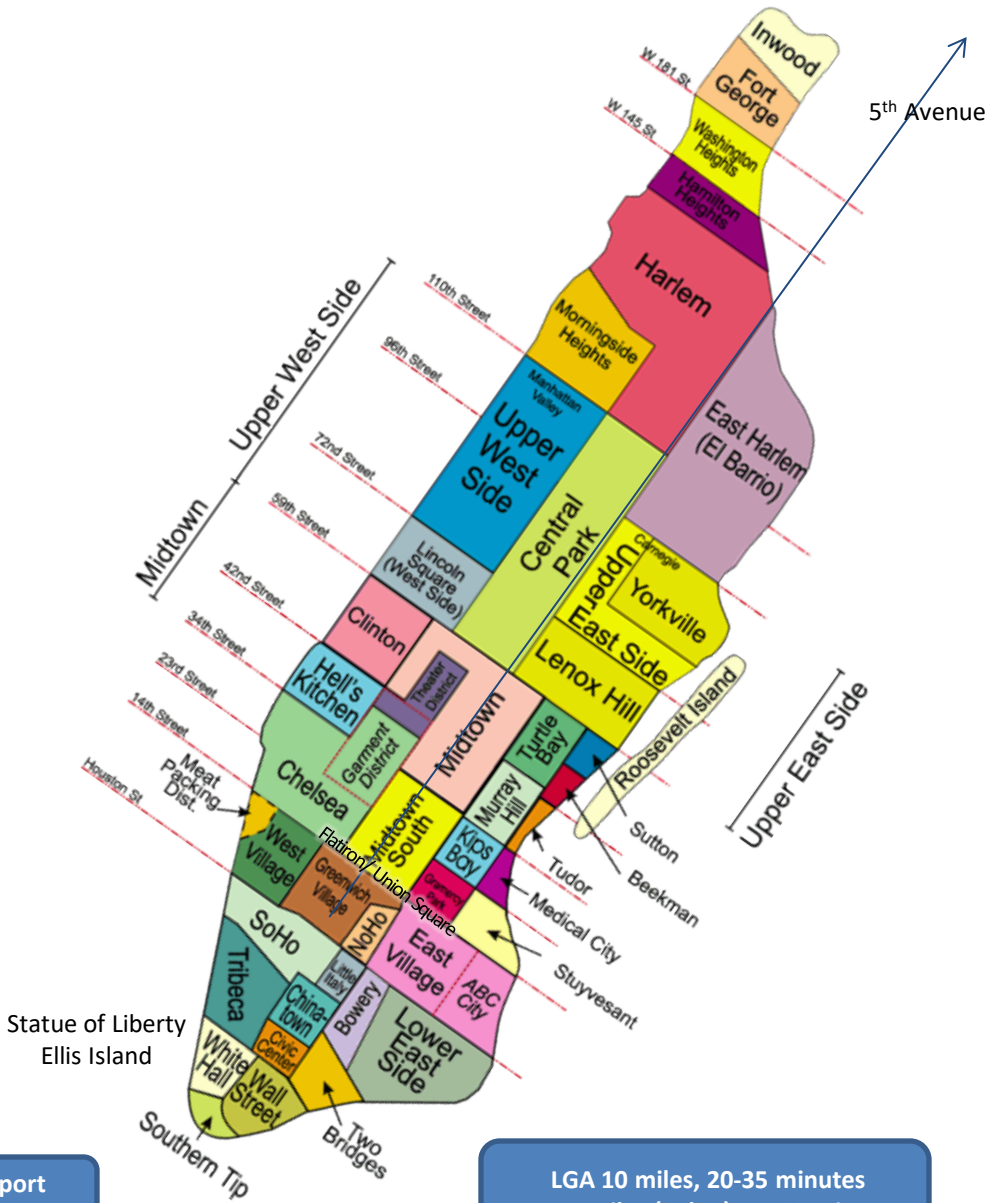

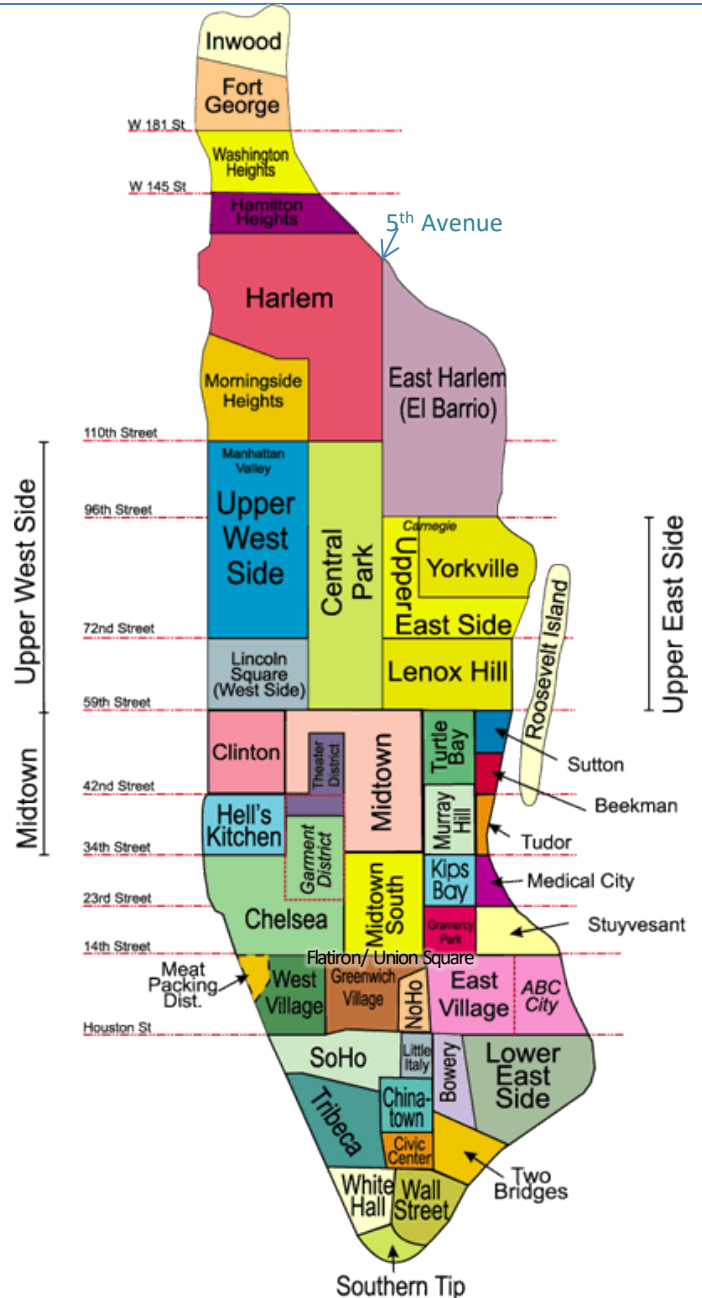
New York Facts

- Manhattan is ONLY
- 13.4 miles Long (North to South)
- By 2.3 miles Wide (21.5 x 3.7 km) East to West
- All other maps will show Manhattan as going due North to due South, but this is how Manhattan is really laid out
- Avenues go North to South
- Streets go East to West
- A subway ride from north to south, would take an hour on the Express Lines
- Uptown is generally above (north) of 14 Street and Downtown is below
- Fifth Avenue divides East and West. Example: East 46th or West 46th Street
- 20 Street blocks is roughly a mile (ex, 30th Street to 50th Street)
- 1 Avenue is roughly two Street blocks (ex, 1st Ave to 2nd Ave)



Newark (EWR) Airport
14 miles, 35-50 minutes

LGA 10 miles, 20-35 minutes
JFK 15 miles (25km), 45-60 minutes



North/South Lines

- **Green** 4/5 (express) 6 (local) – Lexington Ave (which is like 4th Ave)
- **Yellow** – N/R/Q/W –Broadway
- **Orange** B/D/F/V –6th Ave
- **Red** 1 (local) 2/3 (express) –7th Ave
- **Blue** A/C/E –8th Ave

East/West Lines

- **7** (purple) or Shuttle to/from Grand Central and Times Square
- **L** (Gray) from Union Square to or from 8th Ave/14th Street stop
- Local subway stops are roughly 9 blocks apart
- Metrocards:
 - a) Unlimited Cards: 7-Days (\$31) and 30-Days (\$116.50)
 - b) Per Ride Cards purchased in amounts from \$5 to \$100, with 5% bonus applied every \$5. \$2.75 is deducted per subway ride

- Passes based on # of attractions, good for 30 days.
- 3 for \$76 (\$25 each), 5 for \$119 (\$24 each), 7 for \$149 (\$22 each), 10 for \$179 (\$18 each). Also have customizable printable passes, spend more, save more and pick your specific attractions.



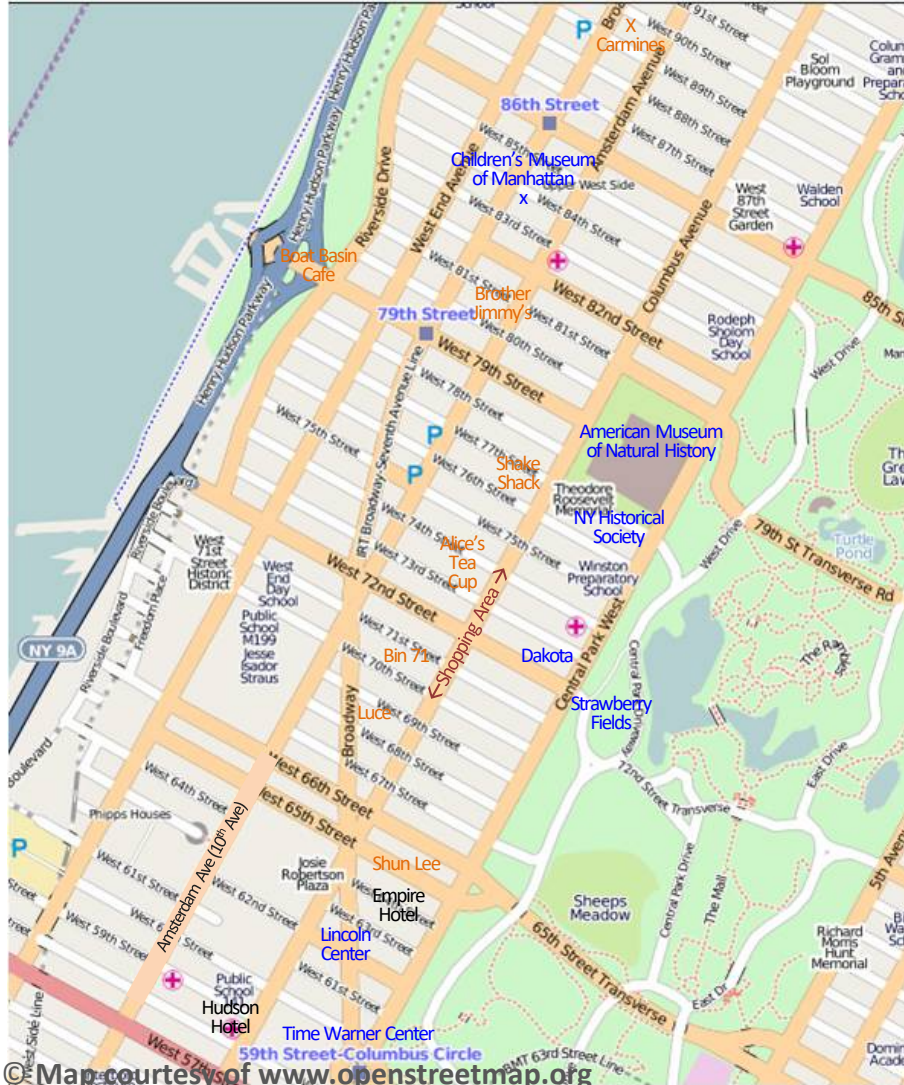

- Only pass to include AMNH Space Show

Things to Do

- **Children's Museum of Manhattan** (212 W 83rd, Amsterdam /Bway) - Hands-on activities, kids art, sandbox table, oversized Lite Brite, water playground. Best for youngest (under 7). \$10, Closed Mon.
- **American Museum of Natural History** (CPW, 77th-81st St) - Great exhibits, all about humans, man, cultures, dinosaurs. The Planetarium and Space Show is a must-see for kids and fun for adults. Suggested Contribution: \$16 (museum), \$9 ages 2-12. Planetarium: \$24, \$14 children, includes Museum access and contribution.
- **New York Historical Society** (170 CPW, 76th/77th) – permanent exhibits of New York furniture, furnishings, toys, souvenirs and very interesting rotating exhibits, slavery, Jackie Kennedy/Eleanor Roosevelt . Closed Mon. \$12 Adult, Under 12 free.
- **Lincoln Center** (Bway, 61st to 66th Sts) - home to the New York State Theater, New York City Ballet, New York City Opera, the Metropolitan Opera House, Avery Fisher Hall, the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, the Vivian Beaumont Theater, Jazz at Lincoln Center (located at 59th Street), the Library and Museum of the Performing Arts, the School of American Ballet and the world-famous Julliard School of Music.
- **Time Warner Center** (TWC, at Columbus Circle)– enormous shopping and dining mall with ranging from typical chains to unique NY to very high end.
- Walk **Columbus Ave** for boutiques and restaurants, Amsterdam Ave for bars and boutiques, CPW for park views and history, such as the Dakota (72nd), where John Lennon was shot, and pay respects across the street at the **Strawberry Fields** memorial. Check Whole Foods in the TWC to grab a **picnic for Central Park** and definitely walk around the **Lincoln Center** – lots of free concerts.

Restaurants

- **Carmine's** (2450 Bway, 90th/91st) – huge portions, family style Italian. This is the original and a 2nd is now in the Theater District. A tourist favorite.
- **Brother Jimmy's West** (428 Amsterdam, 80th/81st) - Old fashioned BBQ (not the best, but reliable). Crayons, skeeball and video games. Usually, kids eat FREE with \$10 paid adult meal. Additional locations.
- **Boat Basin Café** (W 79th & Hudson River) – casual, outdoors in Riverside Park at the end of 79th Street on the Hudson River with beautiful views. (Seasonal, Spring to Fall)
- **Shake Shack** (336 Columbus, 77th) – great burgers, fries and shakes with a huge NYC following.
- **Alice's Tea Cup** (102 W 73rd, Columbus) - Bakery and Desserts/Ice Cream , a wonderland for little girls
- **Isabella's** (359 Columbus/77th) – Italian/Mediterranean. Great for lunch and dinner, outdoors in summer.
- **Bin 71** (237 Columbus Ave, 70th/71st) - more of a wine bar than restaurant, but excellent small plates, casual but hip scene and outdoors in the summer.
- **Luce** (2014 Bway, 68th/69th) - Italian . Especially nice in summer, with outdoor eating.
- **Shun Lee** (43 W 65th , CPW/Col) – upscale Chinese. Excellent service and food, family friendly. (Note: lately it's been getting mixed reviews, but I've always had good experiences).
- Time Warner Center – **Dizzy's Jazz Club**, **Landmarc**, **A Voce** (romantic Italian), **Per Se** (NYC's MOST expensive meal), **Porter House NY** (steak), **Stone Rose Lounge** (trendy)

Shopping

- Columbus Ave from about 70th to 85th St - local NYC boutiques, along with dozens of well known chains: UGG, Eileen Fisher, North Face, Barnes & Noble, etc. Local faves include Verve (bags), Olive & Bette's (trendy clothes), Liana, Berkley Girl (for tweens).
- Time Warner Center has many chain and high-end shops such as Cole Haan, Stuart Weitzman, Hugo Boss, Coach and J. Crew
- Century 21 (1972 Broadway) – designer discount shopping. Designers include Armani, Pucci, Prada and Missoni, great shoe department for both men and women.

Hotels

- **Mandarin Oriental** (80 Columbus Cir) – 5 star hotel, 35-54 floors of the TWC. Voted as best spa in NYC, if you can't afford to stay, head to the 35th floor lobby for a cocktail or snack. One of the best views in the City.
- **Hudson Hotel** (356 W 58th St) – amazing lobby outdoor garden, feels like a mini Central Park.
- **Empire Hotel** (44 W 63rd St) – Cool pool deck with cabana rentals (May to Sept) and fantastic roof views.

- Note: Street Names change on the UWS: Central Park West (8th Ave), Columbus Ave (9th Ave), Amsterdam (10th Ave), West End Ave (11th Ave)
- Subways: **C** Central Park West, **1/2/3** Broadway,

Basics

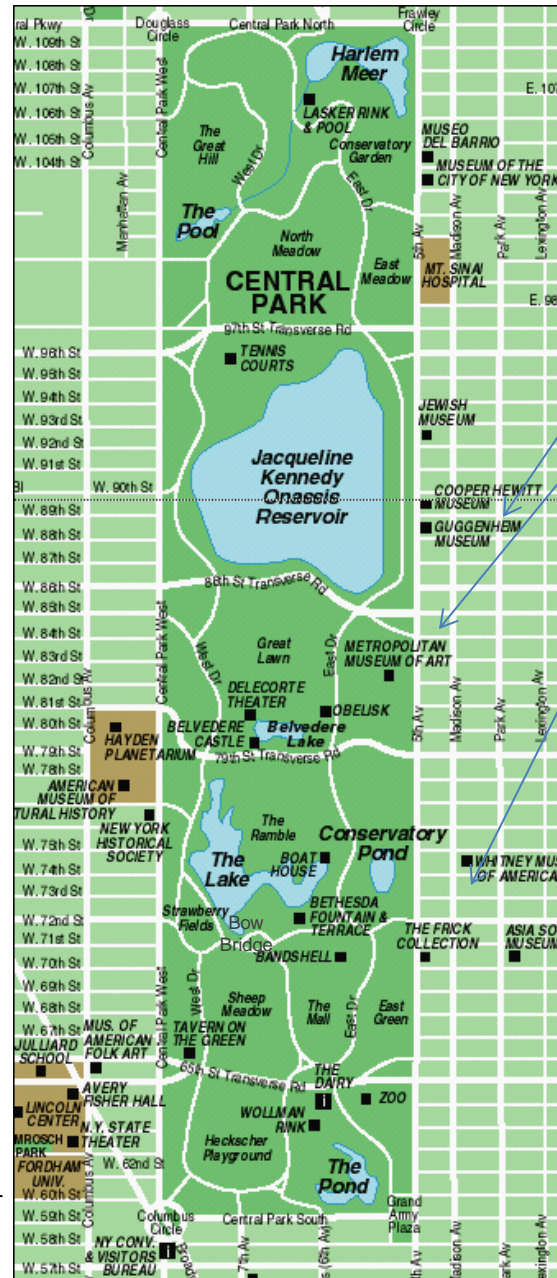
- The only vehicles allowed in Central Park are across the traverses, at 97th, 86th, 79th and 65th Streets
- You may take taxis or buses through these routes, but no drop offs in the Park
- Bus routes labeled accordingly (M96, M86, M79, M72 and M66)

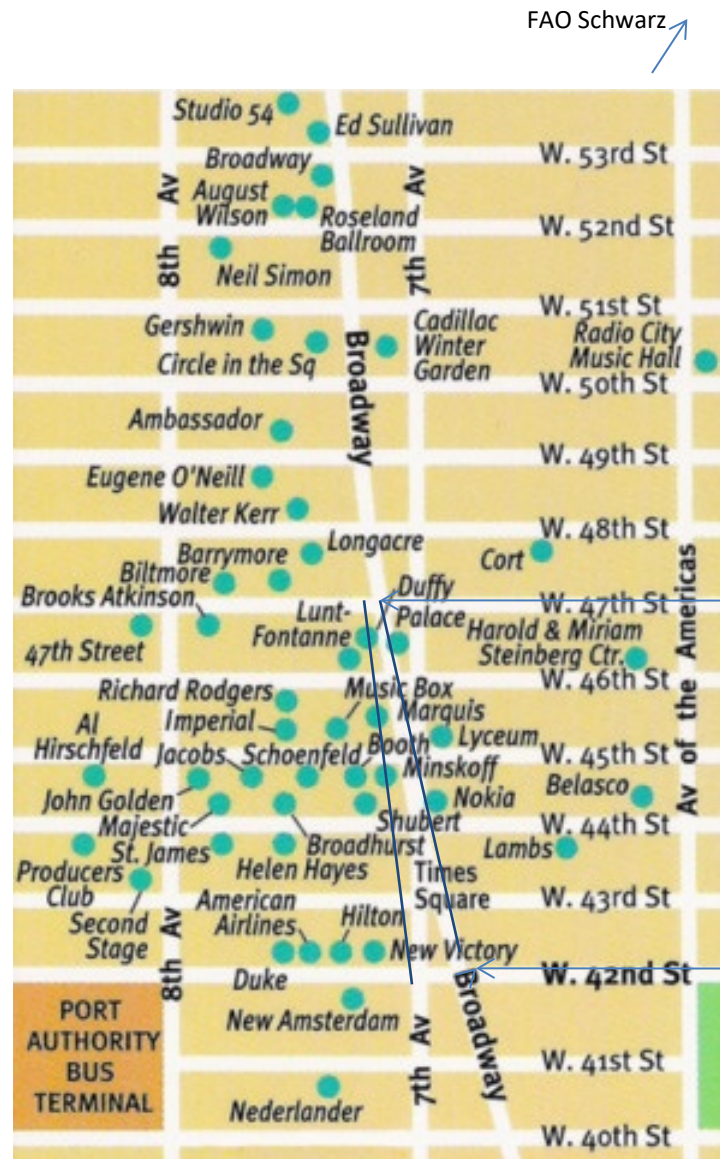
- **Ruby Foos** (1626 Bway/49th St).
