
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## Things to Do

- Extra Virgin (W 4<sup>th</sup>, Perry) especially for brunch
- **Del Posto** (85 10<sup>th</sup> Ave, 16<sup>th</sup> St) Upscale Italian, pricey, but worth it. Great for a special occasion.
- Morandi (211 Waverly Place, 7<sup>th</sup> Ave) rustic Italian, same owners as Balthazar in SoHo
- Cowgirls Hall of Fame (519 Hudson at 10th St) Eight kinds of bbq sauce for kids to do taste tests, games to play. Rumor has it, if the waitress likes you, the kids get cowboy/girl hats.
- Café Wha? (115 MacDougal St, Minetta Lane) live music and original stomping ground for Bob Dylan, Jimi Hendrix, Bruce Springsteen, Peter, Paul & Mary and others.
